In September 2018, the then-President of the United Nations General Assembly Miroslav Lajčák declared *multilateralism to be under threat*. If the erosion of commitment to multilateralism of key actors in recent years and the outbreak of successive crises on the global scene have confirmed the centrality of the United Nations, they have also reinforced the need to make the organisation more effective and more representative of the current balances in the world. What does multilateralism mean today, after the Aachen Treaty and in the light of the most recent developments on the global scene? What role should the United Nations play in the future? How can the European Union strengthen its commitment to effective multilateralism in post-Brexiting times? What are the most topical debates today in the Security Council reform - from expanding membership to reforming the veto or making the Council's work more open and transparent?
